OPEN: Unrestricted entry.

NOVICE: Confined to dogs which have not gained a place or Certificate of Merit at a Field Trial, 1st, 2nd,

or 3rd in an Open Working Test, or 1st in a Novice Test held in accordance with Kennel Club

Regs

PUPPY: Confined to dogs of a specific breed **less than eighteen months old on the test date**.

NOVICE DOG/NOVICE HANDLER: (unclassified). You (or your dog) must **not** have won a 1st in a Novice Dog/Novice Handler Working Test, or a 1st, 2nd or 3rd in any Novice Working Test or **any** award in an Open Working Test or Field Trial hold in asserdance with KC regulations.

Open Working Test or Field Trial held in accordance with KC regulations.

VETERAN: Open to dogs aged 8 years and over on the day of the test.

All children must be under the supervision of their parent/guardian at all times.

Much of the terrain at our events is uneven and can make walking difficult, especially in adverse weather. Please make sure you are fit enough and dressed, to adequately cope with the grounds.

As per Kennel Club Ltd J regs: No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling at a working test. No person attending a working test may allow a bitch in season to be on the ground.

Welfare of Dogs: Any competitor whose dog is entered should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met; and should not knowingly put their dogs' health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. A breach of this Regulation may be referred to the Kennel Club Board for disciplinary action.

The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted.

Conduct of Gundog Working Tests Rule 4H applies. Open Gundog Working Test sub-groups, must have at least one Kennel Club Ltd. Field Trial Panel Judge officiating.

Photographs are regularly taken at working tests. If you do not want to be photographed, please speak to the photographer.
